

## Join us for Plastic Free July!

We've heard the statistics about the terrible plastic pollution in our oceans -- about 8 million tons of plastic entering the sea every year -- and if we continue at this rate there will be more plastic in the ocean than fish by 2050.

What we don't tend to hear as much about is the plastic pollution right here in our backyard and that 20 Million pounds of plastic make their way into our Great Lakes each year. To put that in perspective, that's the equivalent of 100 Olympic-sized swimming pools filled with plastic bottles being dumped into our Great Lakes EVERY YEAR.

The International campaign for a Plastic Free July was created to help bring awareness to our plastic pollution crisis and encourage people to rethink their use of plastic. ## Did you know?

- Since 1950 more than 9 billion tons of plastic has been produced!
  - o To put in perspective, that is more than ONE TON of plastic for every person alive today.
- If we continue at this rate, plastic production is expected to quadruple by 2050!
- We have developed a "disposable" lifestyle and estimates are that around 50% of plastic is used just once and

thrown away -- this is the stuff we're seeing litter our coastlines and our Great Lakes.

- Plastic never really goes away, it just breaks down into smaller pieces called microplastics that are making their way into the air we breathe and the water we drink.
- Where do plastics go in the US? 75% sent to landfills; 16% burned; only 9% is recycled
  - O A recent study showed that on average, people could be ingesting approximately 5 grams of plastic every week, which is the equivalent weight of a credit card.
