



Steps to Make Your Voice Heard In the 2022 Election!

GET REGISTERED - If you haven't yet cast your ballot, there is still time to exercise your right to have your voice heard. Here are some tips for making sure your vote is counted:

*** VERIFY THAT YOU'RE REGISTERED TO VOTE AND LEARN IF YOUR POLLING LOCATION CHANGED:**

- Go to <https://mi.gov/vote> Here you can confirm your voter registration status; your polling place and hours; view a sample ballot; and track your absentee ballot.
- You can vote if you are homeless or if you have completed a jail or prison sentence or are in jail waiting for trial. Go to the above website for more information.

*** IF YOU'RE NOT REGISTERED, DO SO ASAP:**

- To register to vote on-line, click this link: <https://mvic.sos.state.mi.us/RegisterVoter/Index>
- Register by mail deadline: October 24th. Mail your registration form to the address on the registration form.
- Michigan law allows same day registration. If you've never registered before, go to your clerk's office before 8 p.m. on voting day and register to vote with a proof of residency.

***LEARN ABOUT THE CANDIDATES AND FIND OUT WHAT'S ON YOUR BALLOT:**

- Click [Vote411.org](https://www.vote411.org) to visit the Michigan League of Women Voters on-line voter's guide. It provides background on all the candidates on your ballot and information on ballot issues. Click [HERE](#) for a summary of three ballot proposals supported by MUUSJN

*** VOTE!**

- Go to this website to learn about your options for applying for an absentee ballot: <https://www.michigan.gov/sos/all-services/absentee-ballot>
- You can mail your absentee ballot (postmarked) by October 24th or you can take your ballot to a drop box near your clerk's office. Go to www.mi.gov/vote to learn the drop box location for you. You can also take your absentee ballot to your clerk's office.
- Or you can vote in person -- the traditional way -- at your polling place on November 8th!
